Hands on the Past

Invite a professional archaeologist into your classroom and explore real archaeological finds from the Roman, Viking, and Medieval periods. Handle artefacts and replicas, and, using resource materials, discover how we study the past and why it is important today.



Using a specially designed "rubbish pit" equipped with modern and ancient rubbish, investigate themes and activities taken from the History, Maths, English, and Science programmes of study within the National Curriculum.

A Viking in the Classroom!

Unearthed

Bring JORVIK'S Unearthed exhibition to your classroom and learn how evidence from the past can help create a picture of life and death from the Early Medieval period.

Using the unique Unearthed touring resource children will explore scientific processes in association with related themes such as Disease, Diet, and Medicine. Children will examine bone material and make comparisons in relation to diet, nutrition, medicine and injuries between then and now.

The session uses audiovisual equipment to bring the subject to life and creates the opportunity for group discussion and listening skills to be developed. All of the associated activities are strongly linked to the National Curriculum and include Teacher's notes, which can be used for follow up activities.

JORVIK offers school groups the opportunity to explore Viking Age York, travelling through an authentic reconstruction of the Viking City, which was unearthed by York Archaeological Trust during the 1970's. Groups can also meet and talk to JORVIK's Viking residents, watch Viking craftsmen in the "Fearsome Craftsmen" Exhibition, and barter with a Viking Trader.



The ARC allows groups to experience hands-on archaeology. Exploring a reconstructed excavated trench, sifting through environmental samples, handling real artefacts, and discovering the past through Viking and Roman finds. Sessions are led by trained archaeologists, and themed workshops targeting numeracy, literacy, and history are offered
